TRANSLATIONAL STUDIES FOR THE CORRECT UNDERSTANDING OF MRKH SYNDROME

11:25am Dr Emanuele Pelosi

To date, the causes and pattern of inheritance of MRKH syndrome are completely unexplained. This lack of understanding leads to inadequate diagnosis, counselling, and clinical management of affected women. In order to lead a change in the current clinical experience of women with MRKH, we need a different research approach based on translational studies. In collaboration with Sisters for Love MRKH Foundation, we have established a genomic program to identify gene variants associated with MRKH syndrome, and we have identified novel genes necessary for the correct development of uterus and vagina. In this presentation, I will talk about the journey and the research that lead to the creation of the first mouse model of MRKH type II, a one of a kind resource that will pave the way to further understand the causes of this condition.
